Queensland Blue Grass

Dichanthium sericeum

Tall, slender, erect, tussocky.
Tends to grow in swards.
An excellent soil conditioner, it colonizes, often with Red Grass,

Previously ploughed or heavily grazed country. Beautiful in the morning or evening with the sun slanting onto it.

Occurs on many soil types and in many ecosystems. Palatable and good protein levels.

Identification

Perennial grass, 30-80 cm

Stems smooth, hairless, densely branched at the base and often from the upper nodes.

Nodes have a "ballet skirt" of hairs.

Leaves 8-15 cm long, 2-4 mm wide, with prominent white midribs, and edges.

Seedhead beautiful, bluish or pale green, reminding me of "pussy willow" seedheads.

Flowering in warmer months with good rainfall.
